## Permits: Welding — Generators — Painting

### Welding Guidelines

Clark County Fire Department (CCFD) requires permits they call “Hot Work Permits” if you plan to weld or grind anywhere on the property.

#### Specifications and Requirements

The typical welding demo is confined to a small area with each hot work activity lasting only a few seconds. When the proposed demo seems more complex than the typical welding company demo, the CCFD may choose to look at it more closely before issuing the permit. At the time of permit application, three (3) sets of plans, drawn to an indicated scale, must be submitted for review and approval. Once the plans have been approved and any outstanding fees have been paid, an inspection can be scheduled.

#### COST

- **Base Fee** - \$75
- **Expedite Fee** - \$160 ( received less than 10 business days)
- **Late Submittal Fee** - \$235 (received less than three business days)

### Generator Guidelines

A permit shall be obtained from the Clark County Fire Department (CCFD), Fire & Hazard Prevention Services Division through SEMA Show Management for a temporary diesel generator.

#### Specifications and Requirements

- Specify that tank is UL# 142 or equivalent
- Indicate quantities of diesel to be stored
- Identify type of secondary containment
- Submit copies of manufacturer’s literature for auxiliary tank(s) and generator
- Provide a site plan indicating the location of generator in relation to structures, other tanks and to property lines.

#### COST

The fee is \$160, and a check must be made out to CCFD (no credit/debit). You may also be charged escalating fees depending on the total amount of gallons **after** the plans have been reviewed.

## Las Vegas Convention Center - Painting Guidelines

The Las Vegas Convention Center requires written permission for any painting done inside the building. If you are airbrushing (water base or oil base) or demonstrating paint booths, contact Michael A. Massey, CFI-I, CFI-II, CBPE, LVCVA Safety Coordinator, Tuesday–Saturday from 6:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m. at [mmassey@lvcva.com](mailto:mmassey@lvcva.com) or call 702/892-7467.

Once you receive approval from Building Safety, e-mail your approval to Show Management at [salesmgr@ConvExx.com](mailto:salesmgr@ConvExx.com) along with your company name and booth number. If you have any questions, contact your Account Executive at 702/450-7662, ext. 120.

**NOTE:** Spray painting is not permitted inside any Las Vegas Convention Center exhibit halls and must be done outside.
